





13% of all Children in the UK may have an undiagnosed common eyesight problem

Vision Screening of School Children aged 4 to 5 years only happens in 55% of Local Education Authorities

Current screening is a practical assessment and does not look at the mechanics of the individual eye

Free optician run eye tests are available post Lions Screening to ensure that a formal diagnosis is in place











After 10 years of dedication, lots of hard work and influencing PID Phil Nathen's Vision for the British Isles is almost there







Lions of MD 105 are Knights of The Blind

The camera is a quick and easy way to screen a large number of young people in a short space of time

Each scan gives us one of two results Green or Red, this then allows Lions to give a Green or Red Letter to the young person's parents

Both letters refer the parents to an optician – one for regular testing the other for a review in the following weeks



Test Pilot Area's



We identified three areas for a pilot of the cameras

- Colchester 276 Children Screened
 25 Children referred to optician (9.1%)
- Coventry 84 Children Screened
 8 Children referred to optician (9.5%)
- Bournemouth 310 Children Screened
 40 Children referred to optician (12.9%)





Launch

Accompanied by Third International Vice President Lion Mark Lyon and Lion Lyn we went to Lyons Hall Primary School in Essex to carry out our first official screening Yes we had the Lyons screening at Lyons School!









Next Steps

Screening across Essex and wider District CE from September

Training for the Camera Operators will roll out District by District

Every screening will follow the same procedure, every time, to ensure continuity of screening

Districts & Clubs are currently raising funds to buy camera's – some of these will be eligible for match funding from LCIF – application to be submitted shortly
